A. Principal Activities

The core objectives of the Ministry of Coal are to augment coal production by adopting stateof-the-art clean-coal technologies; enhancing exploration efforts with thrust on increasing proven coal resources and developing necessary infrastructure for prompt evacuation of coal for securing its availability to meet the demand of different sectors of the economy in an eco-friendly and sustainable manner.

B. Important achievements

- Meeting of High Power Expert Committee in regard to the development of National Coal Index was held on 07.05.2019 at Scope Complex, Lodhi Road, New Delhi.
- Meeting was held on 02.05.2019 regarding Issues of villages in the Geological Block of Meral Coal Mine at Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi.
- Meeting headed by Secretary (Coal) was held on 30.05.2019 regarding Single Window System for expediting operationalization of coal mines.
- There are 29 operational mines. The production during the month of April, 2019 is 1.94 Million Tonne.
- Revenue in the month of May, 2019 is Rs. 104.69 Crore.
- The Coal Controller Organization has reported that the total production of coal from the allocated captive coal blocks for the month of May, 2019 is 4.985 Million Tonnes (Prov.), out of which aggregate coal production of those coal blocks which have not been cancelled by the Hon'ble Supreme court viz. Moher & Moher Amlori Extn. (1.549 MT), Tasra (0.000 MT) and Pakri Barwadih (0.757 MT) is 2.306 Million Tonnes (Prov.)

<u>Promotional Drilling:</u> A programme of Promotional/NMET (Regional) drilling comprising 1.18 lakh meters in coal and 0.35 lakh meters in lignite has been drawn up in Annual Plan 2019-20 of CMPDI. The programme is under execution by MECL, DGMs of Nagaland & Assam and CMPDI.

As against this, the achievement of drilling upto the month of May, 2019 is 0.20 lakh metre, against the target of 0.20 lakh metre, which is 100% of the target and registering a growth of 13% over the same period last year.

Overall Progress of Detailed Drilling in 2018-19: For 2019-20, a target of 13.75 lakh metre of drilling (Departmental: 5.00 lakh metre, Outsourcing: 8.75 lakh metre) has been envisaged. As against this, 2.04 lakh metre of drilling has been carried out upto the month of May, 2019 against the target of 1.68 lakh metre, which is 121% of the target.
